These systems for supplier evaluation do not always include audit in the primary production. For a product to be KRAV-certified the extra requirements must be verified also in the primary production.

- Sedex/SMETA The Sedex Members Ethical Trade Audit (SMETA) Measurement Criteria, version 6.1 (2019)
   Only when primary production is included in monitoring and auditing.
- amfori BSCI Code of Conduct (2014 and 2021)
  Only when primary production is included in monitoring and auditing.

### **Evaluated but not Recognized Standards for Social Responsibility**

Standards that have criteria for social responsibility, where the standards or the system does not fulfill KRAVs criteria for recognition.



• IFOAM Norms for Organic Production and Processing

Version 2.0 (2014) certified by IOAS accredited certification bodies. **Motivation:** The standard does not include special conditions for young workers, to ensure that the work is not harmful for their health or development.

KRAV-certified companies, which initiated a transaction for importation or bringing in products certified against IFOAM Norms for Organic Production and Processing during 2023 or earlier, can continue to KRAV-certify these products during 2024, if the products come from the same supplier. For products not previously KRAV-certified and products imported or brought in via new suppliers, the actual list of Recognized Standards and Systems for Supplier Evaluation applies.

**Motivation:** Based on a risk assessment, companies with less than 20 employees can be excluded from control, something that is not consistent with the KRAV standard.

- Control Union Fair Choice Social and Fair Trade Standard v.3.0 (2013) Motivation: The standard does not include special conditions for young workers, to ensure that the work is not harmful for their health or development. It is unclear how often physical audits are made.
- Eco Vadis Supplier Sustainability Rating (version 2017)
   Motivation: The system does not include any physical audits.
- Ecovalia Normas Ecovalia v.02 (2014)
   Motivation: The standard is not available on the web site of Ecovalia, and it is unclear if it is in use.
- AIJN Code of Business Conduct of the Fruit Juice Industry (2015)
   Motivation: It is not clear that the system includes external audits.
- SPP Global (SPO) General Standard of the Small Producers' Symbol, Version 9.2. (2015) and 17.0 (2022),

**Motivation:** The standard permits small producers to have employees, and the standard does not include social responsibility for these. The control system permits certification without audit at the farm for the first two years.

- The Wieta Ethical Code of Best Practice, Version 3.0 (2016)

  Motivation: The certification system connected to the standard does not require that all primary producers fulfill the criteria.
- CSQA Certification Program of IFOAM Norms for Organic Production and Processing Rev. 06 – 22.11.2022

**Motivation:** The certification system fulfills KRAVs extra requirements for operators in Italy. Since Italy is not included in country group 1, KRAV does not recognize the certification system for country group 1.
